



WHAT IS CHILD FIND?



The Colonial Beach Public School System conducts an on-going campaign of locating, identifying, and evaluating those children residing in the jurisdiction, between the ages of 0 and 21, who are suspected of having a disability. Any child who is identified as having a disability is entitled to a free, appropriate, public education which is designed to meet his/her individual needs. Special Education Programs are available through your public school division. Contact Lacey Neitzey, Director of Special Education. (See contact information below.)

School divisions provide services to children determined eligible within the following disability categories when the identified disability affects their educational performance.

- **Autism**
- **Developmental Delay**
- Deaf
- Deafness
- Hearing impairment
- Intellectual Disability
- Multiple Disabilities, including two or more impairments at the same time.
- Orthopedic Impairment, including those caused by congenital anomaly, disease and other causes such as cerebral palsy.
- Other Health Impairment, such as limited strength, vitality, or alertness due to chronic or acute health problems.
- Emotional Disability
- Specific Learning Disability
- Speech and Language Impairment
- Traumatic Brain injury
- Visual Impairment including blindness impairment in vision that even with correction, adversely affects a child's educational performance.
